ECAR Travels Cross Country on Wood (No Gas)

ECAR \$10,000 Challenge

Alexander City, AL, May 4, 2012 - ECON has launched **ECAR-5**, the fifth in a line beginning with **ECAR-1**, in a south-to-north duplication of their **famous 1979 east-to-west run on wood fuel alone**. ECAR-5 is in the process of completing this Key West to the Canadian Maritime Provinces jaunt in a biomass-powered pickup truck.

More than 30 years ago, Ben Russell and his team drove a wood powered car across the country, from Jacksonville, FL, to Los Angeles, CA. ECAR-1 utilized the long-proven method of gasification, which converts solid wood to its gaseous form, enabling its use to power a standard automotive engine. Gasification is best known as the technology which was used extensively in Europe during WWII when gasoline was rationed, and some one million vehicles resorted to this process.

Near the end of the first cross-country trip in 1979, Russell gained credibility after being featured on *Good Morning America*. "We put the back tires into the Atlantic Ocean at Jacksonville, FL, went to the West Coast on less than a cord of wood and put the front tires into the Pacific Ocean in California. We drove 2,700 miles without a single drop of gasoline," according to Russell.

On April 17, 2012, Russell, with his team, departed Key West—again starting with his tires in the Atlantic Ocean—with a stop at home port, Alexander City, AL. On May 6, 2012, the Russell Team will continue their journey up the eastern seaboard and eventually end in Canada, with a stop at The Hendricks Head Light House, Maine—restored by Russell in the late 1980s.

The latest system will power a standard internal combustion engine – diesel or gasoline. The unit weighs about 300 pounds and will fit into the bed of most standard pickup trucks. A special metering device replaces the carburetor, ensuring no gasoline use— the gas tank has also been removed. No other modification to the engine is necessary.

ECAR's ultimate goal is simply to demonstrate the need to create a national contingency plan to use biomass as an emergency fuel source for cars, trucks, tractors, etc. in the unlikely event of gas rationing or a national emergency.

"Due, however, to the deluge of confusing gasification stories on the web," Russell states, "some order must be established within the science, and I am willing to post a \$10,000 challenge to any serious entity to better the performance of ECAR-5."
